E-Books

At the beginning of the academic year, E-books were introduced as a pilot project in grades 4-6. Students and teachers embraced the new technology enthusiastically although it seemed to be a daunting task at first. Gradually, E-books became easy and fun to work with because of their many benefits which include saving space, time, and money. E-books provide users with a whole library of books in one hand accessible at their fingertips wherever they went.

It is a great tool for visually-impaired students as it gives the opportunity of altering fonts and customizing the settings. Students and teachers can add notes, bookmark pages, highlight, copy, paste, and work interactively with books and workbooks. In addition, the underlined vocabulary and the availability of a dictionary, make learning more effective. ISC-Lahore Becomes a Power House in Swimming

Over the past few years, ISC-Lahore has experienced great success in the swimming field. This term, the school won medals, not only in local swimming competitions but also on the national level, as well. ISC-Lahore student Maya Chaudhary, represented Pakistan in the South-Asian Aquatics Championship (SAAC), 2016 which included swimmers from Pakistan, Afghanistan, India, Nepal, Maldives, Bangladesh, and Sri Lanka.



Maya won the bronze medal in the "Open age, 1500-meter freestyle" swimming, becoming the first Pakistani girl to participate in a 1500-meter freestyle competition.

Not to be outdone, Meerab Bajwa, Mishaal Imran, Ramsha Rizwan, Zoya Mir, and Aliza Maqsood took the 7th Inter-Schools and Colleges Games 2016 in Lahore by storm, winning 13 bronze, 4 silver, and 3 gold medals, and winning with a total of 161 points.

The boys also participated in the 1st Aitchison Swimming Carnival. Our students won 2nd place. Reebal Ashfaq in Grade 10A won 4 gold medals and 1 silver medal in addition to Abdullah Ashfaque in Grade 7A who won 1 gold, 2 silver, and 1 bronze medal.

We would like to thank our coaches who put their time and effort in training us. We congratulate the swimmers on their achievements. It looks like ISC-Lahore will be a force to reckon with in the upcoming Regional Tournament in Oman.

Preparations are well underway with our sports coaches working hard with the teams, training them after school hours, and allowing them to participate in different sports events and competitions.

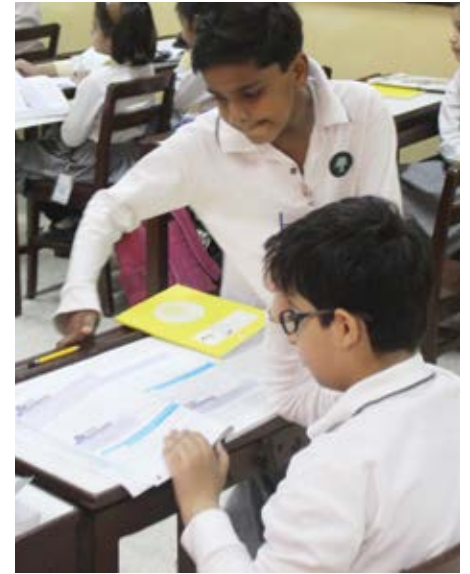
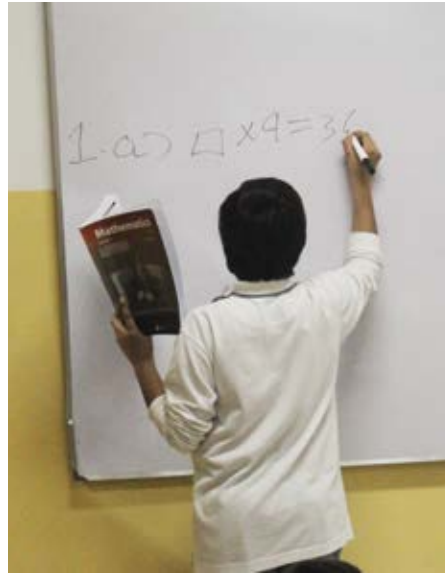
